

### CBD-COP10 Forum for Community-Academia Dialogue –Mainstreaming Biodiversity–



The "CBD-COP10 Forum for Community-Academia Dialogue 'Mainstreaming Biodiversity'" was held at Nagoya University (Chikusa-ku, Nagoya) on September 4 (Saturday) and 5 (Sunday), 2010. The Forum was attended by 550 people on the first day and 400 people on the second day. A total of 110 presenters and general participants also

attended the informal social gathering on the Saturday evening.

On the first day, under a theme of "What are the issues facing Japan and the rest of the world?" Dr. Ian Thompson (senior research scientist at the Canadian Forest Service) delivered a keynote address, regarding the Convention on Biological Diversity and main arguments of COP 10. At the following two sessions, reports were presented on current biodiversity issues in Japan and the rest of the world.

On the second day, under a theme of "What should we do?," four sessions were held in the morning, in which reports that delved more deeply into the topics presented on the first day was presented. In the afternoon, two panel discussions were held to consider the use of land and resources as well as the nature of life, business and society in the 21st century.

Although a considerable amount of time was set aside for Qs and As session, as a trial to connect viewpoints of citizens (society) and viewpoints of experts (academia), the time was ran out because so many questions was asked at sessions and panel discussions. The fact shows that citizens and experts stepped closer to each other.
